



**Application for Registration of Aircraft**

This form, when completed, should be forwarded to the Director-General of Civil Aviation, Civil Aviation Department, 10/F Commercial Building, Airport Freight Forwarding Centre, 2 Chun Wan Road, Chek Lap Kok, Hong Kong, and must be accompanied by the statutory fee. This sum should be paid by cheque made payable to 'The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region' and crossed.

NOTES

1. The signature ordinarily required is that of the owner(s) or, if the owner is a Corporation or Company, the signature of the Managing Director, Secretary or other official duly authorized to sign.
2. The attention of all persons completing and signing the form is drawn to the importance of ensuring that the entries are correct, and in particular the answer to paragraph 8. The making of a false statement for the purpose of procuring the issue of a Certificate of Registration is an offence under the Air Navigation (Hong Kong) Order 1995, as amended.
3. The Registrar of Aircraft may, in any case in which he thinks it desirable, require the applicant for a Certificate of Registration to make and subscribe a statutory declaration as to the truth of the facts set out in the application.
4. A body corporate seeking to register an aircraft pursuant to Article 4(3)(d) of the Air Navigation (Hong Kong) Order 1995, as amended will need to satisfy the Director-General of Civil Aviation that the company is incorporated in Hong Kong or other parts of the People's Republic of China or incorporated under the laws of Hong Kong, and having their principal place of business in Hong Kong or in other parts of the People's Republic of China.

In order to establish this an applicant should:

- (a) produce evidence of incorporation under the laws of Hong Kong or incorporated in Hong Kong or other part of People's Republic of China; and
- (b) set out the ground for his believing that the company has its principal place of business in Hong Kong or other parts of the People's Republic of China by reference to all facts which are considered by the applicant to be relevant and in particular -
  - (i) each of the places where the company carries on business;
  - (ii) the place or places where the company's executive and management work is done and, if at more than one place, the division of those responsibilities as among the respective places.
5. Applicants seeking to register a leased aircraft pursuant to Article 4(5) may be required to produce details of the leasing arrangement.
