

Disaster Relief Materials May Be Subject to Air Safety Restrictions



Check First

Advice for rescue and relief agencies

- ※ **Observe** air safety requirements
- ※ **Do not carry** rescue and relief materials as passenger baggage
- ※ **Consult** airlines or Civil Aviation Department
- ※ **Make special** dangerous goods arrangement with airlines



Certain disaster relief materials or rescue equipment are classified as dangerous goods in air transport and cannot be taken by relief workers as passenger baggage. Most of them can however be safely transported as cargo with special packing, packaging and transport documents.

Examples

- ※ **Disinfectant** (may be Oxidizer), e.g. bleach, disinfectant powder & water treatment/purifying agent.
- ※ **Fuel/Gas** e.g. butane, diesel, gasoline & kerosene
- ※ **Lights** (may have flammable gas or battery hazards) e.g. torches, matches & lighters
- ※ **Medical supplies** e.g. medical alcohol & peroxides
- ※ **Rescue equipment** e.g. portable generator (with residual fuel) & gas cylinder

- ※ **Food** (except dry ice)
